ARKANSAS STREET, ROAD AND BRIDGE FUNDING SOURCES

In 2012, Arkansans voted in favor of establishing a one-half percent (.5%) sales and use tax dedicated to fund county roads, city streets and bridges. This funding is set to expire in 2023.

Counties and cities receive a total of about \$280 million in turnback funding from the state each year to pay for roads, streets and bridges. Of that figure, 32 percent—or about \$89.6 million—comes from the .5% sales tax. That \$89.6 million is split evenly between cities and counties.

HOW IS THE CITY AND COUNTY TURNBACK AMOUNT FORMULATED?

City turnback and county turnback are calculated differently according to Arkansas law. City turnback is based only upon the proportion a city's population bears to the population of all cities and towns. County turnback is determined from five factors, all having different weight.

Those factors are:

- Area
- · Motor vehicle fees paid in the county
- · Total population
- · Rural population
- An equal, 1/75th share of the remainder

The following pages outline the amount that both counties and cities/towns will lose when the tax expires in 2023.

Annual Receipt Analysis Based on Possible Funding Scenarios


The total turnback revenue generated to pay for Arkansas' county roads and city streets is \$280 million annually. Of that figure, 32% is generated from the current .5% sales tax.
